SUNY Niagara High School Equivalency Program

SUNY Niagara's High School Equivalency program allows students who do not have a high school diploma to work on obtaining a High School Equivalency diploma while earning college credit. Students take courses that meet the New York State 24 College Credit Pathway requirements and may be able to apply the credits to a college degree.

Students pay per credit hour. This program does not qualify for financial aid or scholarships.
